This plan will support the school for the next three years and give us direction. If you are interested in looking into the future of OLPH please let Mrs. Lucero know. All school parents are welcome!!



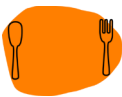
We will be presenting **Second Quarter Honor Roll** on Friday, January 28 after the 8:30 mass. All parents are encouraged and welcome to attend.
